STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Wearing of Fluorescent Clothing When Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., T. 12, § 2468, repealed and replaced. Section 2468 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 405 of the public laws of 1967, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof :

§ 2468. Fluorescent clothing

Any person while hunting with firearms in that area of the State which is open to deer hunting, except when hunting waterfowl from a boat or blind, shall wear fluorescent, orange clothing which is visible from all sides.
