STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Eligibility for Membership on the Council and School Board of the Town of Falmouth.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1961, c. 172, Art. II, § 201, amended. Section 201 of Article II of chapter 172 of the private and special laws of 1961 is amended by adding at the end, a new paragraph, as follows:

Any person who shall have served 2 consecutive 3-year terms as a member of the council shall not be again eligible for membership on the council until the next annual election following the expiration of his aforesaid 2nd term. The provision shall not be applied to any member serving on the council at the effective date of this Act until his next election for a 3-year term.

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1961, c. 172, Art. IV, § 401, amended. Section 401 of Article IV of chapter 172 of the private and special laws of 1961 is amended by adding at the end, a new paragraph, as follows:

Any person who shall have served 2 consecutive 3-year terms as a member of the school board shall not be again eligible for membership on the school board until the next annual election following the expiration of his aforesaid 2nd term. The provision shall not be applied to any member serving on the school board at the effective date of this Act until his next election for a 3-year term.
