STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Violating the Laws Dealing with Certain Birds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2352, amended. Section 2352 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 148 and section 14 of chapter 404 both of the public laws of 1967, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 and in addition thereto by a fine of \$25 for each bird illegally killed, taken or possessed; or by imprisonment for not less than 30 nor more than 90 days, or by both, and such fines shall not be suspended.
