STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Injury or Incapacity of State Police Officer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 25, § 1506, additional. Title 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1506 to read as follows:

§ 1506. Injury or incapacity

When a state police officer is injured or incapacitated as the result of law enforcement related employment, the sick leave taken shall not be charged against the accrued sick leave earned under the Personnel Law and rules.

The determination as to whether this section shall apply to any state police officer shall be made by the Industrial Accident Commission.

In no case shall the period of time under this section be greater than 500 weeks from the date of injury or incapacity.
