STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Logging Near Waterways and on Slopes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 2507, additional. Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2507, to read as follows:

§ 2507. Logging near waterways

It is unlawful to drag logs witth a tractor, tree harvester or skidder through any brook, stream or river having a width of 30 inches or more.

Whoever cuts logs on a side hill or slope shall on completion of the cutting It is unlawful to drag logs with a tractor, tree harvester or skidder through erosion and shall reseed all roads adjacent to any brook, stream or river.
