COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 176, L. D. 215, Bill, "AN ACT Extending the Territory of Brunswick Sewer District."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of that part designated "Sec. 1." and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 1. The Brunswick Sewer District created. The territory in the Town of Brunswick within a radius of 2 1/2 miles from the location of the Town Hall as of January 2, 1969, and in addition thereto the area enclosed within the following described boundaries; Beginning at a point on the southerly side of New Route U. S. #1 where the 2 1/2 mile radius intersects said road; thence easterly along the southerly side line of said New Route U. S. #1 a distance of 1 1/4 miles; thence southerly a distance of one mile; thence westerly and parallel to the first mentioned bound a distance of 1 1/4 miles; thence northerly a distance of one mile to the point begun at, the Town Hall as of January 2, 1969, with the inhabitants thereon, is created a body politic and corporate by the name of Brunswick Sewer District, hereinafter called the district, for the purpose of providing and maintaining within the district a sewer system and suitable sewers, drains and sewage disposal plants, and with all the rights, privileges and immunities incident to similar corporations, or necessary for the accomplishment of these
