STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Hauling Lobster Pots on Sundays.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4458, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 4458 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 327 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

From June 1st to August 31st of each year, during the period from 4 p.m., Eastern Daylight Saving Time, on Saturday to ½ hour before sunrise of the following Monday morning it is unlawful for any person to raise, haul or transfer from the tidal waters of this State any pot, trap or other contrivance that is set for the taking of lobsters or crabs, except that, with the approval of a coastal warden, the owner of a lobster pot or trap may retrive such pot or trap on a Sunday following a storm.
