## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 104th LEGISLATURE

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 218, L. D. 268, Bill, "AN ACT to Incorporate the Town of Palermo School District."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the present buildings which house the schools of the Town of Palermo are overcrowded and inadequate for the need; and

Whereas, it is imperative that action be taken at the earliest possible moment to relieve these conditions; and

Whereas, it is vitally important to the inhabitants of said town that this matter be acted upon by the voters at the town meeting in March, 1969; and

Whereas, plans and specifications have been drawn which will enable summer construction and fall opening of classes; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the headnote and the first sentence of "Sec. 8." (same in L. D. 268) and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Emergency clause; referendum; effective date. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved, only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the Town of Palermo at the next annual or special town meeting called and held for the purpose not later than one year after the effective date of this Act.'
