STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT to Provide that Motor Vehicle Operators' Licenses be Issued on a Staggered Basis of Odd and Even Birth Years.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 542, repealed and replaced. Section 542 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 542. Expiration

Every new and renewal license to operate motor vehicles issued effective January 1, 1970 shall expire in the following fashion:

1. Even-numbered year. A license issued to a license holder whose date of birth is an even-numbered year shall initially expire at midnight on the license holder's 2nd birthday following the date of issue. Thereafter, said license shall be issued to expire at midnight on the license holder's 2nd birthday following the date of issue.

2. Odd-numbered year. A license issued to a license holder whose date of birth is in an odd-numbered year shall initially expire at midnight on the license holder's first birthday following the date of issue. Thereafter, said license shall be issued to expire at midnight on the license holder's 2nd birthday following the date of issue.

The fee for a license issued for a one-year period shall be \$2.50 and for a 2-year period, \$5.

A person born on February 29th shall, for the purposes of this section, be considered as born on March 1st.
