AN ACT Relating to Powers and Duties of Liquor Inspectors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 55, sub-§ 14, amended. The last 3 sentences of subsection 14 of section 55 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 18-A of chapter 425 of the public laws of 1965, are repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

They shall have the same powers and duties throughout the several counties of the State as sheriffs have in their respective counties; to serve criminal process, to investigate and prosecute violations of any law of this State and to arrest the offenders thereof, and to serve all processes necessary for and pertaining to enforcement of any of the provisions of this Title. All complaints, records and reports of the enforcement division created by this section and those relating to licensing and enforcement of liquor laws, commission rules and regulations are declared to be confidential.
