STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT To Provide that Labor Unions Shall File Certain Statements and Reports With the Commissioner of Labor and Industry and Supply Certain Information to its Members.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, §§ 8, 9 and 10, additional. Title 26 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding 3 new sections, 8, 9 and 10, to read as follows:

§ 8. Labor unions to file information

No person or association of persons shall operate or maintain a labor union in the State of Maine unless and until there has been filed annually with the Commissioner of Labor and Industry a statement in writing, or on a form furnished by the commissioner, signed by the president and secretary of such labor union, setting forth the names and addresses of all of the officers and stewards of such union, the aims and objections of said union, the scale of dues, initiation fees, fines and assessments to be charged to the members and the salaries to be paid to the officers, and a copy of the constitution and bylaws.

§ 9. Members of unions to be given copies of constitution and bylaws

Upon written request of a member of the union, the secretary shall furnish a copy of the constitution and bylaws.

§ 10. Penalties

Whoever violates section 8 or section 9, or whoever knowingly makes or files a statement or report, which statement or report is false in any material representation, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500.
