RESOLVE, Providing Funds for Conservation Education.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, funds for the conservation education program were authorized by the 103rd Legislature for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1968 and June 30, 1969; and

Whereas, funds will be needed on and after July 1, 1969 to provide continuity in this program; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Conservation education; additional appropriation.

Resolved: That the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized to spend its funds to further training in conservation education for teachers and children up to \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1970 and up to \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971. Such moneys may be expended for purposes designated by the Conservation Educational Foundation.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The purpose of this resolve is to continue the conservation education program for teachers and children.
