**AN ACT Relating to the Borrowing Capacity of School
Administrative District No. 14.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, a fire has destroyed the only gymnasium available to School Administrative District No. 14; and

Whereas, there is a critical need for new school construction; and

Whereas, the borrowing capacity of the district is insufficient to meet the need of such construction; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

School Administrative District No. 14 authorized to borrow money. The school directors of School Administrative District No. 14 are authorized to borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$75,000, said sum being in addition to the debt limitations placed upon the district by the Revised Statutes, Title 20, section 304. This authority may be used upon the approval of the voters of the district voting on an appropriate article as set out in the Revised Statutes, Title 20, section 225. This authority is granted notwithstanding any other provision of Title 20 to the contrary.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
