AN ACT Immunizing Dogs Against Rabies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 22, § 1312, repealed and replaced. Section 1312 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 121 of the public laws of 1967, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 1312. Immunization of dogs

It is required that dogs shall be immunized against rabies as a prerequisite for the issuance of a dog license by the town clerks. The Commissioner of Health and Welfare shall issue necessary regulations relating thereto, including but not limited to the following: The establishment of necessary records, reports and related forms; types of vaccines to be used; frequency of immunization; ages or conditions of dogs to be immunized.
