STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Permits for Certain Liquor Licensees Providing Entertainment.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 702, amended. The first sentence of section 702 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

No licensee for sale of liquor to be consumed on his licensed premises shall permit, on his licensed premises, any music, except radio or other mechanical device, any dancing or, entertainment or amusement devices of any sort unless the licensee shall have first obtained from the commission a special amusement permit for which he shall pay to the commission a fee of \$100.
