STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Compensation of Electricians Examining Board and Membership and Compensation of Oil Burner Men's Licensing Board.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 32, § 1151, amended. The 6th sentence of section 1151 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 4 of chapter 69 of the public laws of 1967, is further amended to read as follows:

The members of the board shall each be allowed the sum of \$20 \$30 per day and their necessary travelling expenses for actual attendance upon an examination of candidates for license, and for any necessary hearings.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 32, § 2351, amended. The first and last sentences of section 2351 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 8 of chapter 249 of the public laws of 1967, are further amended to read as follows:

An Oil Burner Men's Licensing Board, as heretofore established and in this chapter called the "board," shall consist of a chairman who shall be the Director of State Fire Prevention, ex officio, Insurance Commissioner or a representative from the Insurance Department delegated by the Insurance Commissioner and 4 other members, called the appointive members, who shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council.

The members of the board shall each be allowed the sum of \$20 \$30 per day and their necessary expenses for travel, board and room while attending to the necessary duties of their office.
