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AN ACT Relating to Cutting of Brown Ash by Indians.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 22, § 4707-A, additional. Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 4707-A, to read as follows:

§ 4707-A. Cutting brown ash

It shall be the right of any certified member of the Passamaquoddy or Penobscot Tribes of Maine to cut brown ash trees anywhere within the State of Maine for basket-making purposes.
