## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

#### AN ACT Relating to Lights on Vehicles Used for Snow Plowing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1462-A, additional. Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1462-A to read as follows:

## § 1462-A. Lights on snow plowing vehicles

All vehicles used for hire for the purpose of plowing driveways and parking lots and all other off public ways areas shall have in addition to the lights required in this Title at least one Auxiliary rotary flashing light, having at least 4-inch seal beams and show amber beams of light over a 360 degree range. Such light shall be mounted to the highest practical point on the vehicle. In addition to the rotary light, there shall be on the left and right sides on the extreme rear of the vehicle at least one amber light sufficient in power to be seen at 500 feet.

The required lights shall be in operation at all times when these vehicles are plowing snow and entering upon public ways.

All vehicles used for hire in plowing snow except those described in section 1462 shall be licensed by the Secretary of State and such application for license shall be approved by a police officer indicating that the vehicle is in conformance with this section. The fee for such license shall be \$5.

Use of the lights required by this section other than while in the performance of plowing snow shall be prohibited and any violation of this section may result in the loss of the license issued by the Secretary of State.
