AN ACT Relating to Electrician's Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 32, § 1151, amended. The first sentence of section 1151 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 6 of chapter 385 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows :

An Electricians Examining Board, as heretofore established, and in this chapter called the "board," shall consist of an executive secretary, who shall be the ~~Insurance Commissioner or a representative from the Insurance Department delegated by the Insurance Commissioner~~ Director of Fire Prevention and 5 other members, hereinafter called the appointive members who shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 32, § 1202, sub-§ 1, amended. Subsection 1 of section 1202 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows :

1. **Application; qualifications.** The board shall issue a license to any person who files ~~an~~ a sworn application therefor and who meets the following qualifications :

A. ~~A~~ For a journeyman electrician's, type S journeyman's or limited license at least 2 years' service as an apprentice or helper electrician, except that the board may give such credit as it deems justified toward such service for satisfactory completion of a course of instruction in the trade in a school approved by the board. For a master electrician's license at least 3 years'

service as a journeyman electrician or at least 5 years' service as an apprentice or helper electrician ;

B. Satisfactory passing of an examination conducted by said board as provided in section 1203 to determine his fitness to receive such license.
