## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

#### AN ACT Relating to Sick Leave Under Lewiston City Charter.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec.1. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. X, § 5, additional. Article X of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is amended by adding a new section 5, to read as follows:

Sec. 5. Sick leave. Employees of the department of public works shall be allowed to accumulate one day of sick leave for every 30 days worked, a total of 12 days per year, accumulating to 120 days. At the termination of employment of the employee, he shall have no claim, monetary or other compensation, for any unused portion of days allowed for sick leave.

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art XI, § 16-A, additional. Article XI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is amended by adding a new section 16-A, to read as follows:

Sec. 16-A. Sick leave. Members of the police department shall be allowed to accumulate one day of sick leave for every 30 days worked, a total of 12 days per year, accumulating to 120 days. At the termination of employment of the member, he shall have no claim, monetary or other compensation, for any unused portion of days allowed for sick leave.

Sec. 3. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XII, § 3-A, additional. Article XII of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is amended by adding a new section 3-A, to read as follows:

Section 3-A. Sick leave. Members of the fire department shall be allowed to accumulate  $1\frac{1}{2}$  days of sick leave per month worked, a total of 18 days per

year, accumulating to 120 days. At the termination of the employment of the member, he shall have no claim, monetary or other compensation for any unused portion of days allowed for sick leave.
