STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Amount of Liquor That May be Imported into State for Personal Use.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 28, § 1052, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 1052 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

It shall be lawful for an individual to transport into this State and to transport from place to place within the State such spirituous or vinous liquor for his personal use in a quantity not to exceed \pm quarts one quart.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 28, § 1053, sub-§ 1, amended. The first sentence of subsection 1 of section 1053 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

No person shall knowingly transport from place to place in this State any intoxicating liquor with intent to sell the same in this State in violation of law, or with intent that the same shall be so sold by any person, or to aid any person in such sale, and no person shall transport or cause to be transported any spirituous or vinous liquor in this State in a greater quantity than \pm quarts one quart, unless such liquor was purchased from a state store or the commission.

Sec. 3. R. S., T. 28, § 1053, sub-§ 2, amended. The first sentence of subsection 2 of section 1053 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

No person, other than a wholesale licensee of the commission under and subject to this Title, shall transport or cause to be transported malt liquor into this State in a greater quantity than one case 6 pints, unless said malt liquor was legally purchased in the State.
