## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

#### AN ACT Relating to Peddling Under Liquor Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 28, § 756, amended.** Section 756 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 756. Unlawful to peddle

It shall be unlawful for any wholesale or retail licensee of malt liquor, either directly or indirectly, by any agent or employee, to go from town to town or from place to place in the same town selling or bartering or earrying for sale or exposing for sale any malt liquor from any vehicle. All sales of such malt liquor where transportation and delivery are required shall be made only upon orders actually received at the principal place of business or warehouse or distributing center, if licensed, of the seller prior to shipment thereof. An invoice stating the names of the purchaser and the seller and the kind and quantity of malt liquor ordered by the sale, together with the date of the sale, shall be carried by the driver or any other employee of the seller.

Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months or by both.
