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**AN ACT Repealing Supreme Judicial Court Messenger in  
Cumberland County.**

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**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it has been determined that the Supreme Judicial Court messenger in Cumberland County is no longer necessary and the position will no longer be filled after July 1, 1969; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary in order to repeal the law creating the position and thus prevent possible confusion; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 4, § 56, repealed.** Section 56 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is repealed.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 1969.
