STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Providing for Pheasant Stamp Under Fish and Game Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2352, amended. Section 2352 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

During the open season it shall be unlawful for any person over 10 years of age to hunt pheasant without first procuring a pheasant stamp. Said stamp to be attached to the back of such person's hunting license, bearing his signature across the face of said stamp. It shall be unlawful at any time for any time for any person to possess a pheasant without first procuring such pheasant without first procuring such pheasant stamp. For the purpose of issuing stamps, the commissioner shall appoint clerks of towns or such other agents as he deems necessary. The fee for a pheasant stamp shall be \$1.25, with 25c to be retained by the issuing agent.
