IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Imposing a Poll Tax of \$5 on Male and Female Residents Between the Ages of 21 and 70 Years.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 36, § 709, amended. The first sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 709 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows :

~~In making the list of polls in a municipality which has more than one voting district, the~~ The assessors shall make a list of the names and street addresses of each male and female resident 21 years of age or over.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 36, § 1381, amended. The first sentence of section 1381 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows :

A poll tax of ~~\$3~~ \$5 shall be assessed upon every male ~~and female~~ resident of the State between the ages of 21 and 70 years, whether a citizen of the United States or an alien, in the place where he resides on the first day of each April, unless he is exempted therefrom by this Title.
