AN ACT Relating to Membership and Salary of State Liquor Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 28, § 51, repealed and replaced. Section 51 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 51. Appointment

The State Liquor Commission, as heretofore established, shall consist of one member to be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, to serve for 7 years and may after notice and hearing be removed for cause by the Governor and Council. The commissioner shall be the chief administrative officer, having general charge of the office and records.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 28, § 53, repealed and replaced. Section 53 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 53. Salary and expenses

The salary of the commissioner shall be \$18,000 per year and in addition he shall be allowed reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of his duties. Such expense shall not include travel between his place of residence and the commission office, or board and lodging in the city or town where such office is located or in the City of Augusta.
