STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Certification of Operators of Water Treatment Plants, Water Distribution Systems and Waste Water Treatment Plants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 22, c. 560-A, additional. Title 22 of the Revised Statutes Sec. 1. is amended by adding a new chapter 560-A, to read as follows:

CHAPTER 560-A

WATER TREATMENT PLANTS, WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS AND WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANTS

§ 2461. Definitions

As used in this chapter:

Board. "Board" shall mean the Advisory Board for Certification re-Ι. ferred to in this chapter;

2. Certificate. "Certificate" shall mean a certificate of competency issued by the commissioner stating that the applicant has met the requirements for the specified operator classification;

3. Commissioner. "Commissioner" shall mean the Commissioner of Health and Welfare:

4. Operator. "Operator" shall mean the person who has direct responsibility for the operation of any water treatment plant, water distribution system or wasterwater treatment plant serving a public purpose;

5. Wastewater treatment plant. "Wastewater treatment plant" shall mean the facility or group of units provided for the treatment of wastewater, either or both sewage and industrial wastes, and for the reduction and handling of sewage removed from such wastes;

6. Water distribution system. "Water distribution system" shall mean that portion of the water supply system in which water is conveyed from the water treatment plant or other supply point to the premises of the consumer;

7. Water supply system. "Water supply system" shall mean the system of pipes, structures and facilities through which water is obtained, treated and sold, distributed or otherwise offered to the public for household use or any use by humans;

8. Water treatment plant. "Water treatment plant" shall mean that portion of the water supply system which in some way alters the physical, chemical or bacteriological quality of the water.

§ 2462. Classification

The commissioner shall classify all water treatment plants, water distribution systems and wastewater treatment plants actually used or intended for use by the public with due regard to the size, type, character of water and wastewater to be treated and other physical conditions affecting such treatment plants and specify the qualifications the operator in responsible charge must have to supervise successfully the operation of said facilities so as to protect the public health or prevent nuisance conditions or unlawful pollution.

§ 2463. Certification

The commissioner shall certify persons as to their competency to supervise successfully the operation of water or wastewater treatment plants and water distribution, or water supply systems after considering the recommendations of the board.

§ 2464. Advisory Board of Certification

The Governor shall appoint an Advisory Board of Certification composed of 5 persons as follows: Two operators; in the case of appointees to the first board the 2 operators must be eligible for certification and receive certificates within one year; thereafter the 2 operator members, one a currently employed wastewater treatment plant operator and the second a currently employed water treatment plant operator, shall be certified as to competency under this chapter, with one of these holding a certificate of the highest classification issued by the commissioner; one from the Department of Health and Welfare who is either the State Sanitary Engineer or such a qualified staff member as the commissioner may recommend; one a public representative; and one a representative of the Water and Air Environmental Improvement Commission.

Each member of the board shall be appointed for a 3-year term except in the case of the initial appointments they shall be appointed for one, 2 and 3year terms. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the Governor for unexpired terms.

Members of the board, at the call of the commissioner, shall organize and elect from their number a chairman. Thereafter, annually, a chairman shall be elected. The Department of Health and Welfare representative of the board shall serve as secretary of the board and be responsible for maintaining records.

The commissioner shall hold at least one examination each year for the purpose of examining candidates for certification at a time and place designated by him. Additional meetings may be called by the chairman or commissioner as may be necessary to carry out this chapter.

The members of the board shall serve without compensation, except for their actual and necessary expenses incurred while discharging their official duties.

The commissioner with the advice of the board shall establish the criteria and conditions for the classification of water treatment, water distribution, water supply and wastewater treatment plants or systems.

The commissioner shall establish by regulation the qualifications, conditions and licensing standards and procedures for the certification of individuals to act as operators.

§ 2465. Certificates

The commissioner shall issue certificates attesting to the competency of individuals to act as operators. The certificate shall indicate the classification level of the systems or plants for the operation of which the individual is qualified to act as an operator.

Certificates shall continue in effect unless revoked by the commissioner, but remain the property of the board and the certificate shall so state.

The commissioner may revoke the certificate of an operator, following a hearing in accordance with Title 5, chapters 301 to 307, when it is found that the operator has practiced fraud or deception; that reasonable care, judgment or the application of his knowledge or ability was not used in the performance of his duties; or that the operator is incompetent or unable properly to perform his duties.

The certificates of operators who terminate their employment at a treatment plant or water distribution system will remain valid for 2 years. After 2 years, the certificate will be automatically invalidated. Operators whose certificates are invalidated under this section may be issued new certificates of a like classification provided appropriate proof of competency is presented to the commissioner.

§ 2466. Certificate from outside Maine

The commissioner, upon application therefor, may issue a certificate, without examination, in a comparable classification, to any person who holds a certificate in any state, territory or possession of the United States or any country, providing the requirements for certification of operators under which the person's certificate was issued do not conflict with this chapter and are of a standard not lower than that specified by regulations adopted under this chapter.

§ 2467. Certificate from owner of particular system

Certificates may be issued without examination to the person or persons certified by the governing body or owner to have been in direct responsible charge of a wastewater or water treatment plant or a water distribution or water supply system on the effective date of this chapter. A certificate so issued will be valid only for that particular treatment plant or system.

§ 2468. Rules and regulations

The commissioner, with the advice of the board and in accordance with any other appropriate state laws, shall make such rules and regulations as are reasonably necessary to carry out the intent of this chapter. The rules and regulations shall include, but are not limited to, provisions establishing the bases for classification of treatment plants in accordance with section 2462 and provisions establishing requirements for certification and procedures for examination of candidates and such other provisions as are necessary for the administration of this chapter.

§ 2469. Fees

Fees for certification shall be not in excess of the following :

Initial certification with examination	\$25
Initial certification without examination	10
Reexamination	25
Reinstatement of certificate	5
Annual renewal fee	3

Fees from those failing to pass an examination will not be returned.

All fees shall be credited to the General Fund of the State.

§ 2470. Certification

On and after one year following the effective date of this chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, both municipal and private, operating a water treatment plant, water distribution system or wastewater treatment plant to operate same unless the competency of the operator is duly certified to by the commissioner under this chapter. It shall be unlawful for any person to perform the duties of an operator, as defined, without being duly certified under this chapter.

§ 2471. Penalties

Any person, firm or corporation, both municipal and private, violating any provisions of this chapter or the rules and regulations adopted under this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor. Each day of operation in violation of this chapter or any rules and regulations adopted under this chapter shall constitute a separate offense.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$5,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
