SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 319, L.D. 1033, Bill, "AN ACT
Creating Somerset County Commissioner Districts."

Amend said Bill in the Title by adding after the word
"Districts" the words 'and Creating Oxford County Commissioner
Districts'

Further amend said Bill by inserting after section 1
(same in L.D.) the following sections:

'Sec. 1-A. R. S., T. 30, §§105-D-105-E, additional. Title
30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding 2 new sections,
to read as follows:

§ 105-D. Creation of Oxford County Commissioner Districts

Oxford County shall be divided into the following 3 districts:
Commissioner District number one consisting of the municipalities
of Byron, Mexico, Roxbury and Rumford.

Commissioner District number 2 consisting of the municipalities
of Buckfield, Canton, Dixfield, Greenwood, Hartford, Hebron, Milton
Twp., Oxford, Paris, Peru, Sumner, West Paris and Woodstock.

Commissioner District number 3 consisting of the municipalities
of Adamstown, Albany Twp., Andover, Andover North Surplus, Andover
West Surplus, Batchelders Grant, Bethel, Bowmantown, Brownfield,
C. Surplus Twp., Denmark, Fryeburg, Gilead, Grafton, Hanover, Hiram,
Lincoln Plt., Lovell, Lower Cupsuptic, Lynchtown, Magalloway Plt.,
Mason Twp., Newry, Norway, Oxbow, Parkertown, Parmachenee, Porter,
Richardsontown, Riley, Stoneham, Stow, Sweden, Twp. C, Upper
Cupsuptic, Upton and Waterford.

§ 105-E. Transition

The transition to the Oxford County district system shall be
made in the following manner: In 1970 the Commissioner District
having the largest population which, for the next term, would not
otherwise be represented on the board of commissioners, shall elect
a commissioner. In 1972 the commissioner from the 2nd largest
Commissioner District which, for the next term, would not otherwise
be represented on the board of commissioners, shall be elected. In
1974 the commissioner from the remaining Commissioner District shall
be elected. Thereafter elections shall continue in a manner so that
each district shall at all times be represented on the board of
commissioners.'
