HOUSE AMENDMENT " A " to H. P. 815, L. D. 1054, Bill, "AN ACT Redefining the Bounds of Merrymeeting Bay Game Sanctuary."

Amend said Bill by striking out in the 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th lines (7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th and 13th lines in L.D.) the underlined words and punctuation "on the ground directly under the southernmost high tension cable to the intersection of said line and a projection northerly of the property line between land of Ransom Kelley and Niles Perkins; thence southerly and westerly by said property line to land of one Blair; thence southerly and westerly by property line between land of Kelley and land of said Blair to the southwesterly corner of said Blair land; thence southerly by a yellow spotted line of trees along the top of the bank" and inserting in place thereof the underlined words and figures 'approximately 100 feet above the high water mark designated by a series of posted signs over the field lands and by posted signs and a single strand of wire through the wooded area thus southerly 100 feet more or less'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of the last 2 underlined paragraphs and inserting in place thereof the following (same in L.D.):

'The use of any motorboat within this sanctuary is prohibited, except that motorboats may be used between the Woolwich shore on

the east and a line on the west designated by a series of red markers adjacent to the edge of the grassy marsh area from Kelley's Point to the southern boundary of said sanctuary.

No firearms may be carried on any part of said sanctuary except in the area designated above for motorboat use. Within this area firearms must be unloaded and wrapped in a complete cover or transported in 2 separate pieces.'
