AN ACT Relating to Special License for Sale of Liquors at Special Events.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 802-A, additional. Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 802-A, to read as follows:

§ 802-A. Special events

Whenever the following requirements are met, the commission may issue a special license for the sale or dispensing of liquors for a period of not more than 14 days, providing the following requirements are met:

1. Unusual. The special event shall be either unusual or unique to the sponsoring group, association or corporation; or a special event for which said group, association or corporation has been specifically organized;
2. Private function. The special event shall mean a private function by invitation only;
3. Fee. Whether the license is requested for one day or 14 days, the fee shall remain the same;
4. Additional requirements. The commission may impose such additional requirements as it deems desirable prior to the granting of a license;
5. Nonprofit corporation; fee. When the special event is sponsored or promoted by a nonprofit group, association or corporation, said license fee shall be \$100;

6. Profit group; fee. When the special event is sponsored or promoted by a profit making group, association or corporation, said license fee shall be \$200.

For the purpose of purchasing liquors, the license provided for in this section shall be considered a retail license.
