SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 826, L.D. 1065, Bill, "AN ACT Relating to Sale of Liquor not to be Consumed on the Premises."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of the last two underlined sentences before the Statement of Facts, and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Hotels, class A restaurants and club spirituous and vinous liquor licensees, their clerks, servants or agents may sell liquor in the original packages to be consumed elsewhere than upon the licensed premises. Such liquor shall be sold for a price 20% above the purchase price from the commission.'
