STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Outlawing Trading Stamp Disbursement and Contests or Games by Establishments Selling Motor Vehicle Fuel.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 10, § 1260, additional. Title 10 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1260, to read as follows:

§ 1260. Motor fuel establishments

No service station or business engaged in selling motor vehicle fuel shall disburse trading stamps as defined, or engage in, promote or in any way operate or participate in contests or games by or through the use of any scheme or device which is for the purpose of promoting, furthering or advertising any business or product whereby a person or persons may receive gifts, prizes or gratuities as determined by chance.

Whoever willfully violates this section shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.
