AN ACT Pertaining to Live Bait Dealers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., T. 12, § 4101, sub-§ 5, additional. Section 4101 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 5, to read as follows:

5. Live bait dealers. A bait dealer licensed under section 2558 may in addition pay a fee of \$50 for a license that allows that person to fish smelts through the ice, from sunset to sunrise, to be fished for with dip nets or drop nets.

The daily limit shall be 8 quarts and the possession limit shall be 16 quarts. Persons holding the additional license under this section may catch bait fish for resale only.

The holder of such a license shall be authorized to have with him one other person while fishing for said smelts, this other person not being required to hold a license, but the daily limit and possession limit shall be the same, and such person shall be used as a helper only.
