## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT to Authorize Limited Supervised Practice by Third-Year Law Students on Behalf of Certain State Agencies and Legal Aid Organizations Pursuant to Court Rules.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 4, § 807, amended. Section 807 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 92 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

Notwithstanding any of the other provisions of this section, a senior law student in a law school in this State approved by the American Bar Association may appear in the courts of the State on behalf of the State or an agency thereof, or under the supervision of an organization providing legal services to the indigent approved by the Supreme Judicial Court on behalf of an individual receiving services through such organization, under rules promulgated by the Supreme Judicial Court stating the conditions under which such appearances may be made, including a specification of the courts and types of cases in which such appearances may be permitted.
