SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 338, L.D. 1136, Bill, "AN ACT Providing for a State Pilotage System for the Penobscot Bay and River, Maine."

Amend said Bill in that part designated "§ 90" by striking out all of paragraph H; and by renumbering paragraphs I and J to be paragraphs H. and I.

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of those parts designated "§ 98" and "§ 99"

Further amend said Bill by striking out all of that part designated "§ 107" and inserting in place thereof the following:

' § 107. Carrying pilot to sea against his wishes

Whenever any master of any vessel shall convey any licensed pilot to sea under circumstances beyond the control of said licensed pilot, the master of said vessel shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than 6 months.'

Further amend said Bill by renumbering sections 100 to 108 to be section 98 to 106.

Further amend said Bill by striking out the underlined figures and words "sections 85 to 108" and "sections 85 to 107", wherever they appear in said Bill, to read 'sections 85 to 106' and 'sections 85 to 105'
