## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Retirement of Chief Liquor Inspector.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 5, § 1121, sub-§ 4, ¶ D, amended. Paragraph D of subsection 4 of section 1121 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 414 of the public laws of 1965, is amended by adding at the end the following new sentence:

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, the chief inspector shall be permitted to continue in said position beyond the attained age of 65 or after completion of 25 years of creditable service, but must be retired at the attainment of age 70.
