# STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

### AN ACT Relating to Delivery of Absentee Ballots.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 21, § 1252, sub-§ 2, amended. The 2nd sentence of subsection 2 of section 1252 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

It must contain a place for the applicant to designate the reason for requesting an absentee ballot the name of a person to whom his ballot may be delivered and a place for the registrar to certify whether the applicant is registered and the party in which he is or desires to be enrolled.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 21, § 1253, sub-§ 2, amended. The first sentence of subsection 2 of section 1253 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

On receipt of a completed application or a request for an absentee ballot signed by the applicant, the clerk shall send or deliver by first class mail, issue or deliver an absentee ballot and return envelope forthwith to him or to a 3rd person designated in the application or request. Notwithstanding this subsection, if in a primary election the applicant within 3 days of the election notifies the clerk that he is incapacitated and desires an absentee ballot, the ballot shall be delivered to the applicant by a person of the same political party as the applicant and who shall be designated by the clerk. In a political partisan election the ballot shall be delivered to the applicant by persons representing at least 2 political parties and who shall be designated by the clerk. In all elections that are not politically partisan the ballot shall be delivered to the applicant by a person designated by the clerk.
