STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Powers and Duties of the Civil Service Commission of the Town of Old Orchard Beach.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1953, c. 179, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 179 of the private and special laws of 1953, as amended by section 1 of chapter 122 of the private and special laws of 1963, is further amended by adding at the end, a new paragraph, as follows:

The commission may adopt and amend rules and regulations for the administration of said police and fire departments, and, at the first regular meeting of the town council for the month of February, shall present to the town council a separate budget and appropriation request for the ensuing fiscal year for each department for appropriate action by that body.

Referendum; effective date; certificate to Secretary of State. This Act shall take effect 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature, only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the Town of Old Orchard Beach at any annual town meeting called and held for the purpose or at the next statewide election. Such meeting shall be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections.

The town clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this Act to the following question:

“Shall the Act Relating to Powers and Duties of the Civil Service Commission of the Town of Old Orchard Beach, passed by the 104th Legislature, be accepted?”

The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

This Act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at said meeting; provided the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act at said meeting equaled or exceeded 20% of the total vote cast for all candidates for Governor in said town at the next preceding gubernatorial election.

The result of the vote shall be declared by the municipal officers of the Town of Old Orchard Beach and due certificate thereof shall be filed by the town clerk with the Secretary of State.
