STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Amount of Food Sold by Class A Restaurants Under Liquor Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 2, sub-§ 18, amended. Subsection 18 of section 2 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 87 of the public laws of 1967, is further amended by adding after the 3rd sentence, the following sentences:

In cities and towns having a population of 20,000 or less, year-round class A restaurants must do a minimum of \$35,000 per year in sale and service of food to the public on their premises. Part-time licensees must do a minimum of \$20,000 business in sale or service of food to the public on their premises.
