STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to State Subsidy for School Superintendents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 20, § 3723, amended. The next to the last paragraph of section 3723 of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 7 of Section Č of chapter 191 of the private and special laws of 1967 and as amended by section 17 of chapter 540 of the public laws of 1967, is further amended to read as follows:

The total salary paid to a superintendent of school including state and local portions shall be used when computing the general purpose aid of a unit. To the subsidy allocation of each unit shall be added that portion of the subsidy that was earned because of the salary of a superintendent of schools, which portion shall not exceed an amount equal to I_{2}^{\prime} times the minimum salary as set forth in section 1901 to which a teacher, holding the same degrees and having the total number of years of experience which the superintendent has in both teaching and in superintending would be entitled. The amount thus added shall be paid to the superintendent of schools under section 154. Every unit in the State shall receive a subsidy allocation in 1968 which is no less than the amount originally allocated for the unit in 1968 by the budget document which was recommended for legislative consideration.
