## STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

#### AN ACT Relating to the Determination of Limited-User Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 23, § 2068, amended.** The first sentence of section 2068 of Title 23 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 240 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

Where any public highway, road, street, town or county way, but not including roads or ways under the jurisdiction of the State Highway Commission, shall, after public notice, be found by the municipal officers of eities and towns governing body of a municipality, acting through the city council or board of aldermen in the case of a city, or through the process of a duly organized town meeting, with regard to such ways located within their respective boundaries, in organized territory, and the county commissioners in the case of such ways, located within their jurisdiction, in unorganized territory, to be of limited use and value to the traveling public, said city, town or county shall not be required to expend any further public funds on such ways, but such ways shall be deemed public ways, and not abandoned and the general public shall have the right to use same, and any person, firm, corporation or association may expend their funds for the upkeep of same on a purely voluntary basis.
