AN ACT Establishing the Boundary Line Between the City of Bath and the Town of Woolwich.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Boundary line between the City of Bath and Town of Woolwich established.

1. The boundary line between the City of Bath and the Town of Woolwich, situated in Sagadahoc County, is hereby established to be the middle of the Kennebec River.
2. Thorne Island and Little Lines Island, located in or near Burnt Jacket Channel, are annexed to and made a part of the Town of Woolwich.
3. That part of Lines Island lying easterly of the middle of the Kennebec River is annexed to and made a part of the Town of Woolwich; and that part of Lines Island lying westerly of the middle of the Kennebec River is annexed to and made a part of the City of Bath.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The charter provisions of the municipalities of Woolwich and Bath establish their boundaries to be the Kennebec River and do not include any of the islands lying in the river between them. This Act will provide an equitable division of these islands which is acceptable to the municipal officers of each municipality.
