#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Requiring Placarding and Bills of Lading on Motor Vehicles
Transporting Explosives and Other Dangerous Articles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1756, amended. Section 1756 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 246 of the public laws of 1965, is amended by adding at the end, a new paragraph, as follows:

No motor truck, tractor, truck tractor, trailer or semi-trailer as defined in section 1 and having a registered gross weight or permit weight of 10,000 pounds and over shall be used to transport over any public way explosives, flammable liquids, flammable solids and oxidizing materials, corrosive liquids, compressed gases, poisons and radioactive materials unless such motor vehicle is displaying placards as prescribed by the U. S. Department of Transportation under the provisions of Title 49, chapter 1, subchapter A, parts 71-79 and as the same shall from time to time be amended, and every driver of such motor vehicles must have in his possession a copy of the shipping paper giving a complete description of the commodity being transported.
