STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Mandatory Fines on Minors Who Violate Certain Liquor Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 303, amended. The first sentence of the last paragraph of section 303 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Any person under the age of 21 years who purchases any intoxicating liquor or any person under the age of 21 years who consumes any intoxicating liquor in any on-sale premises, or who presents or offers to any licensee, his agent or employee, any written or oral evidence of age which is false, fraudulent or not actually his own, for the purpose of ordering, purchasing, attempting to purchase or otherwise procuring or attempting to procure, the serving of any intoxicating liquor, or who has any intoxicating liquor in his possession ecxept in the scope of his or her employment on any street or highway, or in any public place or in any automobile, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50 less than \$25 nor more than \$100 for the first offense, not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 for the 2nd offense and \$100 for the 3rd and subsequent offenses. Such fines shall not be suspended.
