'Sec. 6. P. & S. L., 1969, c. 5, amended. Chapter 5 of the private and special laws of 1969 is amended by inserting after the 2nd sentence, a new sentence, to read as follows: The unexpended balance remaining at June 30, 1969 shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1971."
