

## SENATE 104th LEGISLATURE

SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 1166, L.D. 1487, Bill, AN ACT Revising the Minimum Wage Law."

Amend said Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'<u>R.S.,T. 26, §664, amended.</u> The first paragraph of section 664 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

By reason of the declaration of policy set forth in section 661 and in the protection of the industry or business and in the enhancement of public interests, health, safety and welfare, it is declared unlawful for any employer to employ any employee except as otherwise provided in this subchapter at the rate of less than \$1.60 per hour starting October 15, 1969; nor work more than 48 hours in any one week, unless 1 1/2 times the regular hourly rate is paid for all work done over 48 hours in any one week. Except that on October 15, 1969 to October 15, 1970, those employees in a nursing home or employees in a hospital shall be paid at a rate of no less than \$1.50 per hour and thereafter \$1.60 per hour. The overtime provision of this section shall not apply to the canning, processing, preserving, freezing, drying, marketing, storing, packing for shipment or distribution of herring as sardines, of perishable foods, of agricultural produce, and meat and fish products, nor to the canning, of perishable goods, nor to hotels, motels, restaurants and other eating establishments.'
