**AN ACT** Relating to Retirement Benefits for the Warden, Deputy Warden, Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Correctional Officers or Guards of the Men's Correctional Center and the Maine State Prison Under State Retirement System.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5, § 1121, sub-§ 4, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 4 of section 1121 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 4 of chapter 445 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

A. Any member who

~~(1) Was a member on July 1, 1947 and is the deputy warden, the captain of the guard, or a guard of the State Prison, or~~

~~(2) Is~~ is an airplane pilot employed by the State of Maine; or a member of a fire or police department including the chiefs thereof and sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and in any case, who has at least 25 years of creditable service in his respective capacity, may be retired on or after the attainment of age 55 on a service retirement allowance.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 5, § 1121, sub-§ 4, ¶ E, additional. Subsection 4 of section 1121 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new paragraph E, to read as follows:

E. Any member who is the warden or the deputy warden of the Maine State Prison or the superintendent or the assistant superintendent of the

Men's Correctional Center or any officer or employee of either of these institutions, who is employed as a correctional officer or guard and who has at least 20 years of creditable service in his respective capacity, may be retired on or after the attainment of age 55 on a service retirement allowance and which will be equal to 1/2 of his average final compensation, but must be retired at the attainment of age 60.
