HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1256, L.D. 1588, Resolve, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution Affecting the Apportionment of the House of Representatives.

Amend said Resolve in that part designated "Section 3" by striking out all of the next to last sentence of subsection 3, which reads as follows: "Cities and towns entitled to two or more Representatives under the foregoing procedure may, by affirmative vote of two-thirds of both Houses of the Legislature, be organized into single member districts whereby each legally qualified elector therein is entitled to vote for only one Representative, provided that all such cities and towns are so organized."
