STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE

AN ACT to Allow the Chief Liquor Inspector to Continue in his Position Beyond the Mandatory Retirement Age.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 5, § 1121, sub-§ 4, ¶ D, amended. Paragraph D of subsection 4 of section 1121 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 414 of the public laws of 1965, is amended by adding at the end the following new sentences:

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the chief inspector on the request of the Governor with approval of the Council, the board of trustees may permit the continuance of said chief inspector for periods of one year, as the result of each such request, of the service of the chief inspector who has attained the age of 65 and who desires to remain in service. In no instance shall the power to extend the service of the chief inspector be extended beyond the attained age of 70.
