HOUSE AMENDMENT " B " to H. P. 1271, L. D. 1600, RESOLVE,  
Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution to Provide for Election  
of Members of Executive Council.

Amend said Resolve by striking out all of section 2 and  
inserting in place thereof the following:

'Section 2. Election, term of office and privilege from arrest.  
The Legislature shall, from time to time, establish councillor districts.  
Each Councillor shall be elected by the qualified electors of the  
district entitled to such Councillor and shall hold office two years  
from the first Wednesday of January next succeeding his election.  
Vacancies, which shall afterward occur, shall be filled in the  
following manner: The Governor, with the advice and consent of the  
Council, shall appoint within thirty days from said vacancy a Councillor  
from the same county of the district in which the vacancy occurred,  
and the oath of office shall be administered by the Governor. Said  
Councillor shall hold office for the remainder of the unexpired term.  
They shall be privileged from arrest in the same manner as Senators  
and Representatives.'
